Budget Vote & Trustee Election Tuesday, April 2, 10 a.m.-9 p.m.

South Huntington residents will vote April 2 on a proposed budget for 2019-20 that includes funding for library materials, programs and services that are designed to advance knowledge, facilitate lifelong learning, inspire creativity and strengthen the community.

The proposed \$6.1 million spending plan calls for an increase of 1.64 percent, which is below the NY State tax cap.

The proposed budget reflects the library's values of engaging and empowering users, supporting programs for all ages and maintaining our wonderful facility. It also appreciates the change in the way library materials are utilized. While we maintain a robust print collection, there has been explosive growth in digital materials – e-books, audiobooks, magazines and streaming services, to name a few. We will also realize savings from the library's efforts at becoming sustainable, including installing energy-saving LED lights inside and outside the building. Voting will be held in the library Meeting Room on the lower level. Voting hours are
