### #SHPLGoingGreen

Our library has been working hard toward its Sustainability Certification from the New York State Library Association, a threestep plan to help us meet the current and future needs of the community and ensure that we are sustainable as an organiza-

The first step is environmental, and the library has made great strides in this area, replacing all lights with LED bulbs, increasing recycling and using "green" cleaning products. Library staff have also formed a Green Team that looks at ways we can operate more environmentally friendly.

The newest addition to our library environment is a Learning Garden, which is located just off the reading patio on the main level and is funded by the Friends of the Library.

Ray and José from our maintenance staff are tending and maintaining the vegetables and greens they planted, while shepherding our new Children's Garden Club as some of our young patrons learn about gardening. We plan to donate the harvest to the food pantry.

The other two steps in the sustainability process are

- Social: Treating employees fairly and providing opportunities for growth; being a good neighbor and member of the community, and providing equal access and opportunity to all.
- Economic: Complying with all regulations, adhering to proper governance and managing finances in ways that best serve the community and allow the library to respond and adapt to


