### FROM THE LIBRARY DIRECTOR

They say time flies when you're having fun. It must be true because a career lasting nearly 38 years has streaked by while my wife and I were busy working and raising our family. It seems like just yesterday... and now I am saying good-bye. I will be retiring at the end of June to spend time with my wife and grandchildren and to pursue other interests. When I took my first library job, I never expected it to be the beginning of a wonderful, life-long journey that would lead me to my current position as the Director of the South Huntington Public Library. My time in South Huntington spanning the last 17 years has certainly been the highlight of my career.

The opportunity to work in South Huntington came in January 2001 when my predecessor, Ken Weil, called to ask if I wanted to come to South Huntington to help build a new library. Indeed I did. It is hard to believe that the library building will soon be 14 years old. Since the grand opening in July 2004, we have worked to maintain and improve the facility and our services. We designed a state-of-the-art sound system for the theater and began our concert series with extended library hours. We converted the circulation system to RFID technology; expanded the Young Adult library; installed a whole-building backup generator, and are in the process of adding a community technology center, which will open soon.

I am proud of these accomplishments and I know that none of this would have been possible without the strong support of the community, a visionary Library Board, and a talented and creative staff. I will miss you all. Thank you for your support and friendship.

The Board has appointed Janet Scherer, the library's Assistant Director for the past 10 years, as the new Library Director. The library is in good hands! Congratulations, Janet! -Joe Latini




