


From the Director



I hope that all has been well with you and your families. I am optimistic that there is light at the end of the tunnel and that we soon will be able to transition to a new normal.

During this last year of unprecedented developments, I am proud that our library has been a steady presence in the community, providing access to information; library materials, both print and digital; online programs - even electricity and a place to work last August after Tropical Storm Isaias swept through and the building ran on the backup

generator for eight days. We have heard from so many of you who have found comfort in a good book, a virtual yoga class, a video story time or a take-home

We understand that this has been a difficult and disorienting time. Through it all, we have remained grounded by our core values of connection, awareness, respect and empathy. Whatever the next year brings our way, with these values as our guide, we will continue our mission to foster connections, inspire creativity and satisfy your curiosity, and we plan to do it without increasing your taxes

The library will hold its annual vote on Tuesday, April 13, and you will notice that there is not a budget proposition on the ballot. For the second year in a row, we are holding the line and not seeking an increase in the tax levy. You will have the opportunity to elect two trustees to our library board (see article at right).

I hope that you will continue to use the library and all it has to offer, and I look forward to the day when we can welcome you all in for live programs and community gatherings. Until then, stay well.

Trustee Vote: Tues., April 13, 10 a.m.-9 p.m.

South Huntington residents will vote to elect two library trustees on Tuesday, April 13 from 10 a.m.-9 p.m. in the Meeting Room on the lower level. A mask is required.

The 2021-22 library budget does not call for a change in the tax rate, so there will be no budget proposition on the ballot.

Trustee Stuart Horowitz is running for re-election to a five-year term, and trustee Eleanora Ferrante is running for the final year of the term vacated by Kate Rea. (See candidates' information, back page.)

Voter Information

To vote on April 13 you must be 18, a U.S. citizen and a resident of the South Huntington School District (#13) for at least 30 days. If you are not registered to vote, you may do so on vote day. Identification proving residency is required.







Stuart Horowitz, Trustee



Stuart Horowitz has been on the South Huntington Public Library board since 2000 and has served as president, vice-president and financial chairperson. During this time the library constructed and relocated into its new home, collections and services were expanded, and the library successfully incorporated the internet into its traditional offerings. Library trustees throughout Huntington Town have recognized his work by twice electing him to the

Board of the Suffolk Cooperative Library System where he served as treasurer, vice-president, and president.

Prior to becoming a library trustee Mr. Horowitz was president of the Friends of the South Huntington Library and is still an active member. He recently retired after 50 years in public education, the last 40 as the librarian at Harborfields High School.
