Regina Calcaterra will be here to discuss her newest memoir, *Girl Unbroken*, about her experiences growing up in an abusive family on Long Island. She will be joined via Skype by her younger sister and co-author, Rosie. Kirkus Reviews called the book "courageous and emotionally intense." Regina is also the author of *Etched in Sand*, a memoir that begins the story told in *Girl Unbroken*.

Regina is a partner at the law firm of Wolf Haldenstein where she practices securities litigation and federal civil rights litigation. She serves as the second vice chair to the SUNY New Paltz Foundation Board; as an Ambassador to Library for All, a global effort to eradicate childhood illiteracy in third-world countries; and, on the Advisory Committee to the New York Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children. Budget Vote & Trustee Election

Tuesday, April 10, 3-9 p.m.

The Library will hold its annual budget vote and trustee election on Tuesday, April 10, 3-9 p.m. The library board of trustees will hold its annual budget meeting on Monday, April 2 at 7 p.m. The proposed budget calls for a 0.82% increase, which falls well below the NYS tax cap for FY 2018-19. This results in an estimated increase of \$6.35 for homeowners with property assessed at \$3,300. Copies of the proposed 2018-19 budget are available in the library and online at www.shpl.info.

To vote on April 10, you must be at least 18, a U.S. citizen and a resident of the

South Huntington School District (#13) for at least 30 days. If you are not registered to vote, you may do so on April 10. Identification proving residency is required. Applications for absentee ballots are available at the Reference Desk or by calling the library at 631.549.4411 to request a mailed ballot. Completed ballots must be received by Tues., April 10 at 5 p.m.
