New York Times best-selling author Alice Hoffman is coming to the South Huntington Public Library on Wednesday, October 7 at 7 p.m. to discuss and read from her latest novel, *The Marriage of Opposites*, a forbidden love story set on the tropical island of St. Thomas, about the extraordinary woman who gave birth to painter Camille Pissarro — the Father of Impressionism. Hoffman, who grew up on Long Island, is the author of several best-selling novels including, *The Dovekeepers* and *The Museum of Extraordinary Things*.

TRAVELING TO ST. THOMAS: Sun., Sept. 27 at 2:30 p.m.



Did you know . . .

When we surveyed the community last year, we learned that there are a number of services we should be telling you more about:

- **Notary:** If you need a document notarized, the library has two notaries on staff. General hours are Monday-Friday, 9 a.m.-4 p.m., but please call ahead to make sure they are available. The fee is \$1 per stamp/signature.
- **Homebound Services:** If you cannot get to the library because of illness, injury or disability, we can deliver library materials to you. You can request specific items or you can let us know of your preferences and a librarian will choose items. To arrange for this service, please call Martha Kahn at 631.549.4411.
- **Learn A Language:** Pronunciator is a free, online language instruction service you can use to learn any of 80 languages at your own pace. It offers speech recognition so you can perfect your pronunciation. To access, go to our website at www.shpl.info and click on the blue Learn A Language icon on the left. Register with your South Huntington library card and start learning.
- **Text A Librarian:** Our reference librarians can answer texted queries during regular library hours. Simply text START to 631-887-4382 and instructions will be sent to your phone.

Has your contact information changed?

If you already have a library card, we'd like to hear from you. We know that your phone number or e-mail address may have changed, and we want to be able to get in touch to let you know that items you requested are ready to be picked up. There are a couple of ways to update your information:



- Log into your account and click "Change Your Contact Information."
- In the library, visit the Circulation or Reference desks.
- Fill out the form at right and return it to the library.

Access Your Library Account

Did you know that library cardholders can use their online account to renew items, request materials, pay fines, enable their reading history and more?

Simply go out our website at www.shpl.info and click "View My Account" in the upper right corner. You will be prompted for your library card barcode and password. (If you do not yet have a password, or if you forgot it, you will be able to manage that here.) Once you have accessed your account, you can see what you have checked out, view items on hold and renew materials. Another nifty feature is the ability to keep track of items you've checked out even after they are returned. Click on Reading History to enable the feature. From that day forward, anything you check out will be listed. So, next time you're trying to remember a book title to recommend or want to see what books in a series you've already read, a list will be at your fingertips.
