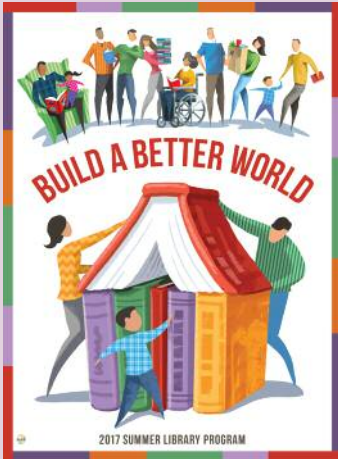


Summer Is Here!

The library has applied for a NYS construction grant for the creation of a technology makerspace that will enable us to expand our current tech services, providing public access to high-end software and

output devices, and to enhance our computer training classes. In response to the growing popularity of our public WiFi, we are planning to upgrade our wireless network, increasing available bandwidth to make sure we can continue to provide fast Internet access.

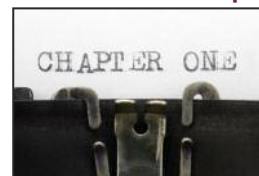
DID MY GREAT-GRANDMOTHER HAVE A FAMILY? A DOCUMENTS AND DNA CASE STUDY

We will take a guided tour of the National September 11 & Memorial Museum, a tribute to the victims and survivors of the World Trade Center attacks and their loved ones. The museum features 110,000 square feet of exhibit space 70 feet below ground. Afterwards, there will be time on your own to enjoy lunch at Hudson Eats at Brookfield Place, an upscale dining terrace overlooking the Hudson River with 14 chef-driven eateries. Then we will meet for a visit to the Freedom Tower, the tallest building in the Western Hemisphere, where we will take in spectacular views of New York City and beyond. 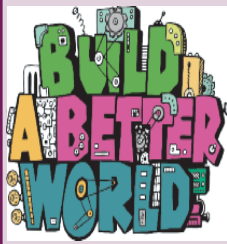

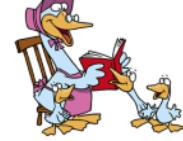
