


South Huntington cardholders can get up to two free tickets online, by phone (631.549.4411) or in person at the Circulation Desk.

Finding out what's going on around the world has never been easier. Did you know that you have access to hundreds of newspapers for free with your library card?

New York Times Digital

You can get free access for three days by clicking on a code redemption link, which can be found on our website at www.shpl.info>

Once you have created your account (or logged in if you are a repeat user), you will receive an email confirmation of your 72-hour access to New York Times digital. Once the 72 hours are up, you can redeem a new code. If you are inside the library, you can access The New York Times from a public computer or your personal device. Simply log in or create an account.

PressReader

This is a digital newsstand with thousands of popular newspapers and magazines from over 120 countries in more than 60 different languages.

To get started, go to our website at www.shpl.info> Books, Movies & More>Magazines and Newspapers> Pressreader. Find our library, log in with your library barcode and PIN and start reading.

You can also download the PressReader app for iOS or Android, find our library and enter your barcode, etc. If you need assistance, contact Adult Services at 631.549.4411.
