


Calling All Book Lovers!

How to register online for an adult program:

- Go to our website at www.shpl.info > Events> Adults.
- Find the date of the event you are interested in on the calendar. (If it is a series, such as a fitness class, go to the date of the first class.)
 - Click on the program title.
- The page that appears will have a program description and registration date.
- Assuming that registration has begun, scroll down to the registration form.
- Type in your South Huntington Library card barcode and other fields as needed.
- If there is a fee, enter your credit card information.
 - Click "Register."
- You should then see a confirmation screen. A confirmation notice will also be sent to the email you entered.
- If it is a ticketed event, such as a concert, print the confirmation page and bring it to the show.

How to access your library account:

- Go to our website at www.shpl.info.
- Click "My Account".
- Enter your South Huntington Library card barcode and PIN.
- If you do not have a PIN, click "Create a Password" and follow the directions on the screen.
- Once you are in your account, you can see what items are checked out and when they are due. You can also update your contact information.
- If you haven't done it already, you may want to enable your reading history so you can begin creating a list to keep track of the books you've read.

All About Tech

To SIM or Not to SIM

Bringing your smartphone abroad can lead to expensive roaming charges. An alternative is to get an unlocked phone and use local SIM cards in each destination. This allows you to access cheaper local rates. Here's what you need to know about using SIM cards for international travel.



When it comes to getting a travel phone, there is no need to get the latest and greatest smartphone (unless you want to, of course). Reliable travel phones can regularly be found for less than \$100. Whatever your price point, the key feature you are looking for with a travel phone is for it to be 'unlocked'. An unlocked phone is a phone that's not associated with a particular phone carrier. The benefit of this is that you can easily switch between phone carriers. For our purposes, this also means you can easily swap out the SIM card.

A SIM card is a tiny memory chip inserted into a smartphone that allows the phone to connect to a phone carrier's network. For example, a Verizon SIM card is what allows your phone to connect to Verizon's network. With an unlocked phone, you can enter in the SIM card of a local phone company from your destination country and take advantage of local pricing for talk, text, and data.

Prepaid SIM cards are usually available to purchase in your destination country's airport; but, if you feel comfortable venturing out and away from tourist areas and the airport, you can potentially find them even cheaper in local stores. Going to multiple countries? Just swap out the SIM card in each new destination country.

An alternative to physical SIM cards are eSIM. eSIM is a digital SIM card that you can download to your device. It is a newer technology so not all devices support this function; but, for those that do, getting a foreign SIM card can be as easy as downloading an app, choosing the price that's best for you, and following the instructions they provide. Some popular eSIM card companies include Airalo, Holafly, Nomad, Simify, and Drimsim, but there are many others so it is worth it to do some research and com-

Depending on the length of your trip, using a SIM card from your destination country can save you money but it is always worth doing the math and considering the risks. Will you be doing activities or going somewhere there is a high potential for losing or damaging your phone? Is the international pricing from your phone carrier high? If the answer to those questions is yes, you might benefit from using different SIM cards with an unlocked device.

Services for the Homebound

The program is designed to provide library materials to residents of South Huntington Public Library who are physically unable to come to the library. This includes patrons who live in a nursing or assisted care facility in the South Huntington School District.
