AARP Tax Aide Program – Tues., Feb. 6-April 9

Volunteer tax preparers from AARP will be available to assist low- and middle-income taxpayers, with special attention to those aged 60 and over. Scheduled dates are Tuesdays, Feb. 6-April 9 from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. An appointment is required. Call the library at 631-549-4411 to make an appointment.



Please be aware that AARP Tax Aide volunteers cannot prepare returns that include rental property, military income, alternative minimum tax or those with many stock transactions.

Please bring to your appointment your current tax records and copies of last year's federal and state returns, along with Social Security (SS) card and photo ID. When scheduling your appointment, please note that some tax information, especially from brokerage firms, may not be sent to you until the end of February.

The AARP Tax Aide program is administered by the AARP Foundation in cooperation with the IRS. Free electronic filing (e-filing) is included. If filing jointly, both people must attend the appointment and show SS card and photo ID.

How to register online for an adult program:

- Go to our website at www.shpl.info > Events> Adults.
- Find the date of the event you are interested in on the calendar. (If it is a series, such as a fitness class, go to the date of the first class.)
 - Click on the program title.
- The page that appears will have a program description and registration date.
- Assuming that registration has begun, scroll down to the registration form.
- Type in your South Huntington Library card barcode and other fields as needed.
- If there is a fee, enter your credit card information.
 - Click "Register."
- You should then see a confirmation screen. A confirmation notice will also be sent to the email you entered.
- If it is a ticketed event, such as a concert, print the confirmation page and bring it to the show.

How to access your library account:

- Go to our website at www.shpl.info.
- Click "My Account".
- Enter your South Huntington Library card barcode and PIN.
- If you do not have a PIN, click "Create a Password" and follow the directions on the screen.
- Once you are in your account, you can see what items are checked out and when they are due. You can also update your contact information.
- If you haven't done it already, you may want to enable your reading history so you can begin creating a list to keep track of the books you've read.


Great Reads for Black History Month

Black History Month is one we can celebrate through literature. Many of my favorite authors are Black, and many of my favorite books were written by Black authors. I think that it is important to celebrate every aspect of Black culture, and these titles span the different facets of Blackness. Here are a few of my favorite picks.

The Love Songs of W.E.B. DuBois by Honoree Fannone Jeffers

This is one of my absolute favorite books. It made me cry and laugh. It is a tome, but it is so worth it. This book spans several generations of the same family, from their Indigenous roots to modern day. It deals



with themes of racism, growing pains, love, familial relationships and much more. These stories interweave and much like a song, and it is one you won't regret listening to.

The Vanishing Half by Brit Bennett

This is a book I actually read in a day. It was so hard to put down! This historical fiction is about a pair of identical twins who grow up in a Southern Black community in the 1950s, and run away at the age 16. One goes on to live as a Black



woman, and the other passes as a white woman. The sisters depart, meet again and their lives intersect and change over the years.

Luster by Raven Leilani

This is a more contemporary novel, with its protagonist being a 23-year-old Black woman, lost in her ways in present-day



urbs where no one looks like her. Guided by her feelings toward the young girl's father, and the fact that Edie can help her, she becomes intertwined with the family in more ways than one.


Sula by Toni Morrison

McBride has become one of my favorite authors, with each of his books surprising me more than the last. This novel was so incredibly good. His writing is humorous, filled with character and sentiment. If you don't read





All About Tech

Digitize Photos at the Library

Need a winter project? Many of us have boxes upon boxes of printed photos tucked away in closets and attics. These may contain precious



memories passed down to us or snapshots we've taken over the years of our friends, family, vacations, and special events. However, keeping physical photo collections has some downsides – photos can fade and/or get damaged or lost over time. Digitizing your photo collection can help preserve these memories for the long run and clear up some space in that cluttered closet.

To assist with your digitizing project, our library has two high-quality photo scanners available in the Technology Center that patrons are welcome to reserve time to use.

The Epson FastFoto FF-680W is a fast photo scanner that can scan a photo in as little as one second. This machine allows you to digitize large batches of photos quickly, scanning up to 36 photos per minute. It also automatically applies fixes during the scan process to optimize images, reducing time spent editing afterwards. Some automatic fixes include red-eye removal, dust cleaning, color restoration, exposure adjustments, and more.

For scanning medium format negatives, slides, and specialty photo formats, we have the Epson Perfection V600. This is a more versatile flatbed scanner with film scanning capabilities. Adapters are available in the Technology Center for 35mm film strips and slides. The accompanying Epson software also includes some handy photo restoration tools for enhancing scans.

Security Helps Keep Library Safe


