How to register online for an adult program:

- Go to our website at www.shpl.info > Events> Adults.
- Find the date of the event you are interested in on the calendar. (If it is a series, such as a fitness class, go to the date of the first class.)
 - Click on the program title.
- The page that appears will have a program description and registration date.
- Assuming that registration has begun, scroll down to the registration form.
- Type in your South Huntington Library card barcode and other fields as needed.
- If there is a fee, enter your credit card information.
 - Click "Register."
- You should then see a confirmation screen. A confirmation notice will also be sent to the email you entered.
- If it is a ticketed event, such as a concert, print the confirmation page and bring it to the show.

How to access your library account:

- Go to our website at www.shpl.info.
- Click "My Account".
- Enter your South Huntington Library card barcode and PIN.
- If you do not have a PIN, click "Create a Password" and follow the directions on the screen.
- Once you are in your account, you can see what items are checked out and when they are due. You can also update your contact information.
- If you haven't done it already, you may want to enable your reading history so you can begin creating a list to keep track of the books you've read.

SHPL SEED LIBRARY

It's safe to say that gardening is officially a thing in South Huntington! Between our popular Seed Library and our new Propagation Station, patrons are engaged with their gardens and are sharing their green thumbs with their neighbors.

Since our Seed Library opened in March, 2021, we have given out thousands of packets of vegetable and flower seeds, most donated by seed companies like Seed Savers, High Mowing, Hudson Valley,

Fedco, Baker Creek and others.

We also had seeds from right here in our South Huntington community. Your neighbors and friends helped to stock our seed library by donating seeds that they saved from past harvests. Some of the interesting varieties that came to us through community donations included multicolored pumpkins, tomatoes, red kidney beans, different types of squash and a whole garden full of flowers like columbine, foxglove, marigolds, snapdragons, hibiscus and many more. Our goal is to eventually stock our seed library solely with donations from our community.

Why is that an important goal? Seed saving and sharing is a practice that is thousands of years old. Native Americans are the original seed savers in our country and some of those heirloom varieties can still be found today. For other heirloom varieties, it's up to us! Saving seeds from heirloom, open-pollinated plants fosters biodiversity, re-

silience in our environment, and sustainable gardening practices.

If you have never attempted to save seeds, you may want to begin with some of the varieties that are considered "easy" to collect, such as tomato, bean, pea,

eggplant, and peppers. For information on beginner seed saving, try the Resources page of the Community Seed Network here: https://www.communityseednetwork.org/resources/

We welcome seed donations of any kind, so give it a

try! When you are ready to donate seeds, stop by the seed cabinet located inside the Adult Library and pick up some of the small, blank envelopes in which you will package your seeds. Write as much information about the seeds as you know on the envelope, return the filled envelopes to us at the Adult Services Desk and we will add them to our Community Donations drawer. Your neighbors can then plant the seeds in their own gardens next spring.

We also invite you to check out our Propagation Station, which is located next to the Seed Library. You can donate cuttings from your houseplants, and you will find cuttings from other patrons' houseplants that you can take home.



All About Tech

When is the Best Time to Buy (Insert Item Here)?

Every other week there seems to be some kind of sale. Whether it's the predictable ones that come before a holiday, or the seemingly random ones that stores do "just because," it can be difficult to know when



the best time to buy is. Luckily, many of the old rules still apply.

You can still find good deals on mattresses around major holidays, clothes at the end of the season, and cars before the New Year. But what if you wanted to buy an air fryer? A dishwasher? A cordless drill?

There are actually better times of the year to purchase these and many other items. So how do we figure out our best chances of getting a great deal? Luckily for us, there are people with a lot more time on their hands than we do who have figured this out, so we don't have to keep track of it all.

There are many charts and guides online, but the one I find the most helpful is through Consumer Reports (which you can access for free with your library card). The Consumer Reports website has an interactive "Best Time to Buy" chart, which allows you to see at a glance what months are best for what purchases. For example, July has many sales revolving around Amazon Prime Day, which in turn prompts other stores to have sales as well, almost like a summer Black Friday.

You can also check it with individual items. I found out very quickly that the best month to buy an air fryer is November. That cordless drill I mentioned? June, November, and December. As an added bonus, you can also access the Consumer Reports reviews to see which particular items they have reviewed and recommend.

Sometimes you do not have the convenience of being able to wait for a sale before making a purchase; but, for the times you do, taking a quick moment to check ahead for the best times to buy can potentially help you find a




